

Graduate Studies

Course Descriptions: Each course is worth 3 credit hours. Credit hours are non-transferrable.

SYSTEMATIC THEOLOGY

Prolegomena, Bibliology, Theology

The purpose of this course in systematic theology is to provide you with an in-depth study of prolegomena and Bibliology. You will study the definition of theology, the different types of theology, and the major divisions of theology; the supernatural origin of the Scriptures as to their general structure; concluding with an introduction to theology proper.

Angelology, Anthropology, Hamartiology

The purpose of this course is to direct you into an in-depth survey of angelology, which includes a study of Satan and demonology; anthropology, a research into the doctrine of man, his origin, state of innocence, and his fall; Hamartiology, a study of sin and its consequence.

Soteriology

The purpose of this course is to give you a full and comprehensive understanding of Soteriology, which is salvation, as it relates to the person and work of Jesus Christ, the work of the Holy Spirit in salvation, and the believers position in Christ.

Christology

This course will provide you with an in-depth study on the preexistence of Jesus the Son of God, and His deity, incarnation, the hypostatic union, and God the Holy Spirit.

Pneumatology

This course will provide you with an in-depth study of Pneumatology or the Holy Spirit. The study is on Theology Proper, or the general doctrines related to the divine Spirit – Holy Spirit.

Ecclesiology, Eschatology

The purpose of this course is to set forth the teachings of the Bible in regards to ecclesiology and eschatology. The first is a study of the church and the second a study of things to come as they relate to Christ's Second Coming. Special unbiased emphasis is paid to comparing and contrasting all eschatological views with presentation of pros and cons of each view.

Apologetics and Contemporary Challenges

This course will survey several of the major problems and criticisms of the Christian church: its history, life, and faith. It will also review the intellectual and faithful responses that Christians have provided to them. An emphasis is given to contemporary challenges to Christian thoughts.

Christian Theology

This course covers key tenets and central doctrines of the Christian faith. Special focus will be on Biblical foundations, historical developments, theological method, major controversies, and confessions.
