

Undergraduate Course Descriptions

Course Descriptions: Each course is worth 3 credit hours. Credit hours are non-transferrable.

BIBLICAL LANGUAGES

Elementary Hebrew

An introduction to the alphabet, vowels, and pronunciation of the Hebrew language, followed by studies of important Old Testament words.

Hebrew II (Prerequisite: Hebrew I)

This course is a continuation of the study of the essentials of Hebrew grammar. Emphasis is placed on reading and interpreting select portions of the Old Testament text.

Elementary Greek

This is an introductory study of the grammar, forms, syntax, and vocabulary of written New Testament Greek.

Greek II (Prerequisite: Greek I)

This course is a continuation of the study of the essentials of Greek grammar. Emphasis is placed on reading and interpreting select portions of the Greek New Testament text.

Hebrew Exegesis (Prerequisite: Hebrew I and II)

This is an exegetical study in an Old Testament book. You will apply your exegetical skills to portions of the text to draw out valid applications for the contemporary Christian community. Extensive translation is required.

Greek Exegesis (Prerequisite: Greek I and II)

This is an exegetical study in a New Testament book. You will acquire a methodology for extracting and interpreting the unique aspects of the text, develop an appreciation of its literary composition, and produce exegetically-based applications for contemporary Christianity. Work in the Greek New Testament and an application-focused research paper is required.

English I

You will cover Basic English grammar and an introduction to basic biblical and theological terms.

English II (Prerequisite: English I)

This course will introduce you to basic biblical passages that will enable you to start exploring the English Bible on your own.

Practical Ministry I

This course will provide you with actual ministry opportunities through structured field experiences and specialized training in conjunction with churches, para-church organizations, and community service agencies (4 Weeks).
