

Graduate Studies

Course Descriptions: Each course is worth 3 credit hours. Credit hours are non-transferrable.

BIBLICAL LANGUAGES

Old Testament Hebrew I

This course is an introduction to Hebrew grammar and will focus on the Hebrew alphabet, vowels, verbs, and basic reading vocabulary.

Old Testament Hebrew II (Prerequisite: Old Testament Hebrew I)

An emphasis is placed on grammar and vocabulary. Stress on weak verbs and basic knowledge of syntax. Exercises and reading of selected texts of Hebrew prose.

Hebrew Exegesis (Prerequisite: Old Testament Hebrew I and II)

You will translation a select book of Hebrew Old Testament or select representative passages (e.g., narrative, law, psalms, prophecy, poetry). You will give an analysis of the text with a view toward preparation for Biblical exposition, preaching or further academic study.

New Testament Greek I

This is an intensive course in basic morphology and syntax of New Testament Greek covering basic alphabet, vocabulary, and grammar.

New Testament Greek II (Prerequisite: New Testament Greek I)

Includes translation and exegesis of a New Testament chapter

Greek Exegesis (Prerequisite: New Testament Greek I and II)

This course develops reading vocabulary and exegetical skills through intensive study of a New Testament Epistle in the Greek text are emphasized.
